Standard Range

The hats and bonnets of the 'Standard' range are designed to make authentic period accessories affordable, without compromising on their accuracy. The durable and stylish bonnets follow period shapes, and are made from a sturdy straw braid. All the bonnets can be ordered as blank forms, made up with ribbons, or lined and decorated.

Bergère



This style of hat was popular throughout the C18th for women of all classes. It could have been elaborately lined with silk and decorated with ribbons and flowers, or simply tied with a ribbon. The hat continued to be used into the C19th as a hat for summer and country wear.

15" is £25, 20" is £30 blank or from £40 made up



Poke Bonnet c.1815

This extremely popular design is instantly recognisable iconic of the regency period. With its large flaring brim and tall crown, it is typical of this period. This style was worn until the late 1830s.

£30 blank or from £45 made up



Spoon Bonnet c.1848

Although dated to c.1848, variants of this bonnet are also seen during the earlier regency period, as well as later into the Victorian era.

£30 blank or from £45 made up



High **S**poon **B**onnet c.1860

This Victorian bonnet typifies the mid nineteenth century, and is particularly suitable for American Civil War use. It ties neatly under the chin, and is often decorated under the brim.

£30 blank or from £45 made up



Cottage **B**onnet c.1850

This simpler style of bonnet is also suitable for a variety of different periods, from the regency through to the 1850s, excluding the 1820s and 30s. It is also suitable for younger bonnet wearers.

£25 blank or from £45 made up
